While providing an attractive setting for Valley Ranch, the hills and valleys of the area are such that some portions of the community have the potential for flooding as a result of heavy rains. IFCD 3 provides for the creation, maintenance and operations of a levee, system of canals and other facilities that help protect the people and property assets in Valley Ranch from these storms.
