

Irving Flood Control District III Financials From a Report by Independent Auditors


The District is a special purpose governmental entity created solely for the governmental purpose of reclaiming and protecting property in the District from flooding.

Approximately 90% of District revenues are derived from ad valorem taxes collected by the Dallas County Tax Collector under contract with the District. Tax revenues are based upon taxable values set by the Dallas Central Appraisal District for property in the District and a tax rate established by the District each year. Property in the District is predominantly single family and multi-family housing. The District has granted a 20% Homestead Exemption but does not allow Freeport Exemptions, any Tax Abatement or participation in any Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone.
